Utkarsh was truly a celebration of culture, creativity, and environmental awareness.

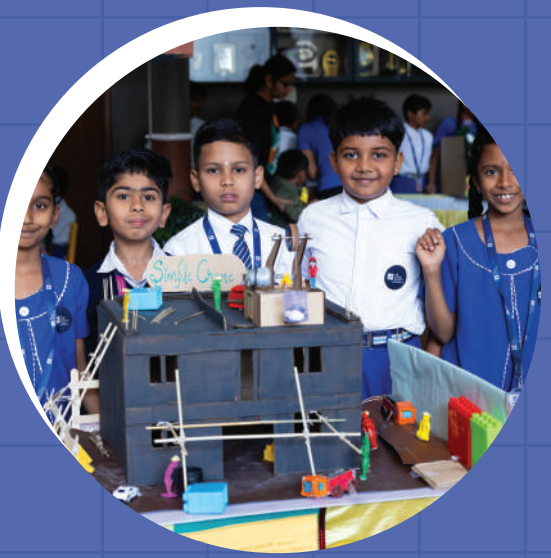
